









Using proper and timely pruning practices will help enhance the curb appeal of your property and increase the life of your plants. Incorrect pruning may result in expensive plant replacements.

Three most important Landscape practices:

- 1) AVOID SHEARING LARGE LEAFED PLANTS. Cutting leaves of large leafed plants can result in unattractive brown edges where the leaf was torn during pruning and may stunt new growth.
- 2) PERFORM "REJUVE" PRUNING IN THE SPRING. Estate's Rejuve pruning is a selective pruning process done by hand at the start of the growing season. Using an intermodal technique, this process encourages new growth and flowering of ornamental plants and shrubs.
- 3) AVOID THINNING OUT THE BOTTOM OF HEDGES. Estate recommends beveling more formal hedges to eliminate this problem.

Incorrect pruning can not only result in an unattractive appearance, but can temporarily or permanently damage the health of plants resulting in costly plant replacements. Estate Landscaping uses pruning techniques that create fuller, healthier looking plants and shrubs.
